FROM THE PASTOR

"I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty." Revelations 1:8 (NRSV)

Transitions. All beginnings will have an ending. All endings have a beginning. The end of July and the beginning of this month are a widely recognized time of transition. With the return of the school year, the summer of 2025 sees its final days wane. Children and youth will be returning to the classroom, and most will be experiencing a new room, a new teacher, and even new classmates as they begin their transition to a new grade. Some children will have a major transition in their life as they end their toddler years and begin the transition to a life of learning. Others will not be returning to high school as they head to college, the military, or even jobs. Teachers too will begin again, another round of education and teaching with a different feel to it.

Transitions are an important part of our lives. We cannot avoid many of them. Some we greatly anticipate, some we greatly dread, some we never expected. However, we know that know matter what is going on in our lives: God is there. God has been there. God will be there.

Here at CRLC we are making transitions too. We are ramping up for Sunday School, the choirs, and other ministries to return from their summer hiatus.

What transitions are going on in your life? What endings are you experiencing? What new beginnings are you anticipating? How does God fit into those transitions? Do we seek to make room for God in them? Do we try to shut God out? Do we wrestle with how God is present within those important moments of our lives? It is important to remember that the Holy Spirit is constantly at work in our lives. God does challenge, comfort, and care for us in the midst of all these things. God is often present in these things in ways we do not even know or perhaps at times cannot even imagine.

I will close with words from a canticle from our old green hymnal of worship. "Keep in mind that Jesus Christ has died for us and has risen from the grave. He is our saving Lord; he is joy for all ages. In him our redemption, in him all our grace. In him our salvation, in him all our peace."

FOR ALL THAT IS TO BE

For all that is to be. This is the title of the worship and music conference I will attend August 4-8, 2025 in Raleigh-Durham, North Carolina. The conference is sponsored by the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians.

I will spend time at Duke University Chapel worshipping together with fellow musicians, hearing a concert by VOCES8 as well as a hymn festival led by Tom Trenney.

The theme, for all that is to be, describes the effort of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians to equip people in all stages of their love for music of the church.

A highlight of the conference will include a concert by The Raleigh Ringers. Under the direction of David M. Harris, The Raleigh Ringers have released eight CDs, and two DVDs. The group has performed in 39 states, the District of Columbia, Canada, England and France during its tours, and plays two dates each year at a major venue in Raleigh. The Raleigh Ringers also sponsors an annual festival for adult ringers, an annual festival for youth and less experienced ringers, biannual sight-reading sessions for those interested in new handbell music, a biennial performance experience for advanced ringers, and handbell techniques classes several times a year.

Tom Trenney and VOCES8, our Ensemble-in-Residence, will lead a hymn festival at the Holy Name of Jesus Cathedral. One of our two grand spaces for the week, the Cathedral is a recent addition to Raleigh and boasts amazing acoustics for singing.

Our final “wow” moment of the week will be a concert presented by the ensemble-in-residence VOCES8. Since its inception in 2005, VOCES8 has performed at many notable venues including Wigmore Hall, Elbphilharmonie Hamburg, Berlin Philharmonie, Cité de la Musique Paris, Vienna Konzerthaus, Tokyo Opera City, NCPA Beijing, Sydney Opera House, Mariinsky Theatre Concert Hall, Victoria Concert Hall Singapore, Palacio de Bellas Artes Mexico City amongst many others. This season they perform over 100 concerts around the world, their 20th Anniversary season, including a birthday celebration concert at the Barbican, London. They have collaborated in concert and in the recording studio with musicians including Paul Simon, Jacob Collier, Eric Whitacre, Christopher Tin, Olafur Arnalds, Cody Fry, Rachel Podger, Jack Liebeck, Bomsori Kim, Jonathan Dove, Chanticleer, The King’s Singers, the Queensland Symphony Orchestra, English Chamber Orchestra, the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, the Philharmonia Orchestra and others.

Through workshops, discussions, worship, and hands-on learning opportunities, I will strengthen my gifts and develop new skills in topics such as worship leadership, technology, composition, enriching assembly song and more.

In the September *Insight*, I will share information about the workshops I attended and their presenters. I am excited to attend this conference and to experience *for all that is to be*.

AUGUST 31—12th Sunday after Pentecost

Invited and inviting—that is the nature of the church. By God's grace in holy baptism we have a place at Christ's banquet table. When, by the power of that same Spirit, humility and mutual love continue among us, the church can be more inviting still.

Are you worried? . . . “Then Jesus said, “Come to me, all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest.” (Matthew 11:28)

Anxiety is a common & natural feeling that everybody experiences. But, if anxiety is significantly interfering in everyday life, then get help. Anxiety disorders can be treated effectively.

Generalized anxiety disorder - GAD causes people to anticipate catastrophe and worry excessively about many things, from overarching concerns such as health, money or work to more routine concerns such as car repairs or appointments. Worries can be accompanied by physical symptoms, such as fatigue, headaches, muscle tension and aches, difficulty swallowing, trembling, twitching, irritability, sweating, and hot flashes. It usually develops gradually and may begin any time during life.

All children experience some anxiety. Anxiety in children is expected & normal at specific times in development. Kids look to their parents for information about how to interpret ambiguous situations. *Our stress responses* can have an impact on children's anxiety.

Risk Factors: *Trauma*, shyness, female, few economic resources, divorced or widowed, exposure to stressful life events in childhood & adulthood, anxiety disorders in close biological relatives, parental history of mental disorders.

Resilience to stress is found in:

- Maintaining an optimistic but realistic outlook - Cognitive & emotional flexibility (***finding a way to accept that which cannot be changed***)
- Facing fear (ability to confront one's fears)
- Turning to religious or spiritual practices
- Seeking & accepting social support
- Imitation of sturdy role models
- Staying physically fit & mentally sharp
- Looking for meaning & opportunity amid adversity





Did you know that we have the ability to receive online giving through our website?
(www.crlcbrecksville.org)

This option will allow for folks to contribute to our congregation using their credit card or debit card. There is not a cost for the church to host this ability, however this is a cost to us for every transaction that is processed. The donor however, can add this fee to any donation they make using this process so that the church receives the full amount intended. This will allow for folks who prefer to handle their giving in this way. This can be used for a one-time donation or it can be set up for recurring contributions. It also will allow specific giving to specific funds in our church. You also can download an app for your phone, and after a one-time set-up, you can easily use your mobile device for giving. Donors also have the ability to have recurring donations directly charged to their Bank or S&L checking or savings account through the church Simply Giving program without needing to use the on-line system. Please contact the church office to get more information or to set up this option."
